I hope that you are all getting through the winter well – that the flu missed you and the snow has not depressed you (too much). But hang in there. Spring is coming! Spring is just around the corner. Let us all thank God for the change of seasons and the new life about to appear. And just like the new life to bud after a long winter, let us thank God for the new life we have been promised when the Lord calls us home to him.

As I write this, the country and the world are reeling from news of the Florida school shooting – the most recent in a string of shameful attacks on our society by Americans. We should be asking ourselves, “what is going on here? Why don’t we do something to correct it?” We have taken God out of our schools, stopped training our kids in Christian morals and principals and to take responsibility for their own actions and accept the consequences that come from those actions. Take a closer look at it some time, it is an unusual design. But PLEASE do not touch it! The old “downstairs” piano is still available “to a good home” (you will, however, have to take it home yourself).

Diane Palzkill and her staff are doing a wonderful job with our Sunday School. The kids learn Bible stories and Christian values while having a really good time. The school remains small, but is growing. There is plenty of room for new students - your children, grandchildren, neighbor’s kids, visitors (or whatever) are all welcome. Sunday School kids meet Sunday morning from 8:15 until 9:15 a.m. It is so nice to see our Church School going again.

Congratulations to Mineral Point HS Junior Michaela Acherman for winning a place on the Driftless Honors Choir. Michaela also achieved a place on the MPHS 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Honor Roll with High Honors. Congratulations to Senior Hans Miller for attaining a place on the MPHS 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Honor Roll, also with High Honors. After competition in the Regional Leadership Conference of the Future Business Leaders of America, Hans also qualified in the Insurance and Risk Management section to go on to the FBLA state competition in La Crosse April 9 & 10.

District Superintendent, Rev. Scott Carlson, held a SPRC training session for churches in the southwest here January 20. It was a wonderful, informative session. EVERY SPRC member should attend next year.

Janet Pollock attended Basic Lay Servant training in Westby in February. This is a really good course that YOU should consider taking. It helps you develop your own Spiritual Gifts and lead you towards service that, in turn, leads you closer to God. Taking it does not commit you to lead worship (or anything else). It is given several times a year in different churches around the District. If you can get a couple of friends to go with you, so much the better. You will be able to car pool and have a good time on the trip while learning a lot that can be of benefit to you. If you want to take any of the advanced courses, you must take the basic course first. The date, time and location for these courses is posted on the bulletin board on the way into the sanctuary (as well in the office) as the information becomes available.

You may have noticed the lack of heat in the sanctuary a number of Sundays this season. We were afraid that would require us to replace the whole system at a cost of about \$80,000. Fortunately, a thorough engineering examination shows that we can repair the system – remove asbestos, repair the boilers and controls and install a chemical water treatment system to keep it going – for around \$10,000. This would be an approximately ten year fix. Work needs to begin in the spring. We will send you all a detailed letter soon

We seriously need money at this point. Our regular operating expenses are well over \$1,000 a week, but there are many weeks when the total income is much less than that figure – especially after Christmas. The Administrative Council was unable to meet in January, first due to sickness preventing a quorum and then bad weather on the rescheduled date. Our meeting in February was rescheduled to mid-month because of snow but the Council was finally able to meet February 15. Unfortunately, this caused our first fund raiser of the year – a Shrove Tuesday Chili Supper – got off to a very late start. There were various factors (including a spaghetti supper at the school) that contributed to that poor showing, but the end result is that despite the hard work put in by the committee, we didn't make very much money on the dinner.

We will have a pasty sale March 10<sup>th</sup>. You must order your pasties in advance as we will only make as many as are ordered in advance. We need YOUR help with this effort! Mostly men peel potatoes Friday morning. No experience needed! We will make pasties Saturday morning. Come help and enjoy great fellowship while helping our church. If you can't help, please order some pasties.

We are planning a pancake breakfast for Palm Sunday morning, March 25 from 8:00-12:00. We will need help with that too. Put it on your calendar!

Wednesday Lenten services going forward (all at 7:00 p.m.) will include February 28<sup>th</sup> at Linden, March 7 at Bethel, March 14 HERE at First, and March 21 at Linden (with a soup & sandwich supper from 4:30-7:00).

Holy Thursday service will be HERE at First at 7:00 on March 29<sup>th</sup>. Good Friday service is on March 30<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 at Linden. Easter services will include a sunrise service at Linden at 7:00 a.m. followed by services at Bethel and Mineral Point at the normal times.

Mineral Point Trustees will meet Thursday March 8 at 6:30 p.m. The Administrative Council's meeting will follow at 7:00 p.m. The Ad Council will meet again Thursday April 12 at 6:30 p.m.

The Cub Scouts will hold their annual "Scouting for Food" drive on March 10<sup>th</sup>

The Mineral Point Historical Society will hold their 3<sup>rd</sup> Lyceum here from 1:00 to 4:00 on Sunday March 18. Paula Dail will present a program on "Women Activists in Wisconsin."

Our Sarah Circle will meet at the Pointer Thursday, March 1<sup>st</sup> and April 5<sup>th</sup> at noon.

The Mineral Point Youth Group will hold their annual garage sale here on Saturday, April 7<sup>th</sup>.

Kami and Chase Grady's son Grady Ivey will be baptized here on Sunday, April 15.

The Inter-church Emergency Food Pantry needs periodic help to date, weigh, sort and shelve (mostly) canned good donations. This is an on-going task, but the biggest push is to process the food brought in by the Cub Scouts in March, the USPO in May and the Cowboy Church in July. Just two hours of your time every once-in-a-while would do it. There is a sign-up sheet in the back of the church or call the office if you have any questions. It's fun!

We would like to welcome Diane Palzkill (at large) and Dave Vandewater (Trustees Chair) to the Administrative Council. Officers remain as before. Many thanks to Karla Vogel and Carol Paynter for their service. We also welcome Don Elmer and Bob Snyder to the Trustees. Dave Vandewater moved up to chairman and Karla Vogel to secretary. The Trustees lost Larry Mitchell to death last year. He has been very much missed.

I hope that you are all enjoying this column. Please let me know if you have anything you would like to see in the next Parish Visitor (May-June). 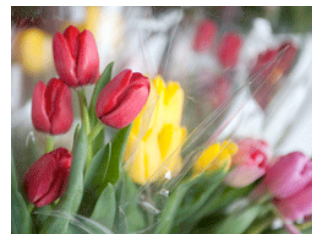

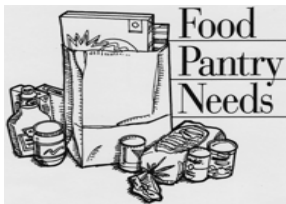

- Red: romance and love







## *When Do We Say Enough?* **February 15, 2018**

He shall judge between many peoples,  
and shall arbitrate between strong nations far away;  
they shall beat their swords into ploughshares,  
and their spears into pruning-hooks;  
nation shall not lift up sword against nation,  
neither shall they learn war anymore;

Micah 4:3

As Christians, we may differ in our understanding of God's will, but there are some very clear messages from our scripture. War, violence, killing, injuring others, vigilantism, and revenge are aspects of our brokenness and separation from God. We are called to be peacemakers, loving mercy, showing compassion, standing for justice, and doing all in our power to spread God's love. Few people debate these things.

Yet, on February 14 – Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day – seventeen students died at the hands of a troubled gunman. It deeply saddened me to see one of the earliest responses to this tragedy was not condolences or sympathy, but a strident defense of the right to own guns in the United States. The core of the defense was that the latest tragedy wasn't about guns, but about the breakdown of our civil society and discipline for our children. Such equivocating breaks my heart.

Children were shot and killed. The scope and reach of this tragedy was definitely connected to guns. We must, as a society, as a culture, and as a Church stop living in denial. Gun violence is out of control in this country. Among developed nations, the United States resides among those at the bottom of the list for gun-related violence. We must take firm action for responsible gun laws. Guns are not tools for peace; they are destroying more and more lives with each passing day.

I am not debating military actions and law enforcement. These are stark and sad evidence of our fallen world. Where there should be peace, we see war. Where there should be justice, we find corrupted law. Where there should be mercy, we see judgment. And so sadly, where we should see young lives flourishing with the possibilities of a hopeful and productive future, we see students down before they get a chance to truly live.

Don't argue and debate guns. Pray with me. Pray for the victims and their families. Pray for the shooter and his family. Pray for the communities, the police, the teachers, the leadership of a world turned upside down. And take action. If you are as saddened and enraged as I am, write to your governor, your senators, your representatives, and your local officials. Invite them to join us in the Wesleyan injunction to first, do NO harm; second, do all the GOOD we can; and last, to strive in every way to ground your life in the love and will of God.
