I have been enjoying the beautiful weather God has been sending our way this spring. We are truly blessed to enjoy His largess while living in such a beautiful land!

The letter explaining our drive to raise money to repair our furnace went out later than intended, but you should have gotten a letter from Pastor Gerhardt explaining what is going on. We have had several generous donations to the HVAC fund so we have about 70% of what is required on hand. But we still need to raise the last 30% before we can sign contracts for the work required. And the repairs need to be completed by fall. I know it sometimes appears as if we don't do anything except ask you for money, but we have very real needs and this is one of them. We don't want to sit in the cold with our coats on during worship services as we had to do several times last winter when the furnace died. Please be generous in your donations to the HVAC Fund.

With some of the hottest days of the year upon us, I am reminded of Larry Mitchell's dream of air conditioning the sanctuary. While serving on the Trustees, he worked very hard to bring this to pass. Unfortunately, he passed before he could accomplish his dream. His visitation and funeral were held in the church in July in a broiling hot building; hazarding the health of his family and visitors. We had several days when we had to move the Sunday service downstairs because of the temperature (and several more when we probably should have). The Trustees are exploring the possibilities and we should have some further information this month.

Friday, June 1st Marion Stone stopped by and visited with Marilyn Owens and Pastor

Gerhardt. Old-timers will remember her as Marion Wearing who played organ for us while she was in school. She is 92, but was able to get right up to the organ and played it beautifully! She is doing well and lives in Oshkosh now.

We don't think about – much less thank – the many people who do the work in the background that make our building look beautiful, our programs run smoothly and life just pass pleasantly for the rest of us. I am sure that I will miss some of the wonderful people who deserve our gratitude, but to the best of my memory some of these wonderful folk are: Dick Gribble who replaces light bulbs as they burn out; Al Martin who keeps our lawns mowed; Karla and Rich Vogel who tend our flower beds; Amy Bossert and Tim Lindholm who bring hot food to the social hour after church many, many Sundays (without signing up to do it); Brigette Dolphin who regularly brings in baked goods for the social hour; Carol Paynter and Marilyn Owens who keep the kitchen running; Ross and Janet Pollock for the many hours they spend working in the food pantry as well as our Parish Administrative Assistant, Marcia Ajer who stays after work when needed to weigh, mark, sort and shelve food for the pantry; Beth Gribble who takes care of the altar; and the many others who are doing God's work here at First.

The Post Office held their annual food drive on May 12th. It produced (literally) tons of food for the Food Pantry (to be exact 2,367 lbs). Volunteers from a number of local churches and the Boy Scouts and the Girl Scouts all helped to process and shelve it. The Boy Scouts, Cowboy Country Church and Post Office all bring in food in the spring and summer. But then there are no further large donations until the following spring. We do donate the excess food we gather to the SWCAP Food Pantry in Dodgeville.

Our annual Steak Feed was held May 19. It raised nearly \$1,700 for our general fund. Many thanks to Tim Lindholm, Amy Bossert, Lisa Springer, and Beth Gribble, who organized and set things up as well as to the many people who worked so hard to make this successful affair happen.

This year the 4th of July falls on a Wednesday. While you are enjoying the parade, the food, the fireworks, give some thought to what the day really means. It celebrates the publishing of the document severing our ties with the mother country (England) and setting forth on our journey to our present status as the premier country in the world – economically, culturally and militarily. It has been a long road, marked by sacrifice and suffering, but we are enjoying the fruits of our ancestors' efforts. Give thanks to them and to our Lord who made it all possible.

On June 15-17 the Wisconsin Methodist Annual Conference was held at the Marriott Madison West located in Middleton. An additional Learning Day was scheduled for June 18.

2018 Theme: "ONE WITH EACH OTHER" - We are better together.

Wisconsin Conference celebrated 49 years gathering together. Going forward, we're 50 years young.

Attending from the Parish of the Hills were Pastor Gerhardt Miller; Ross Pollock, Mineral Point; and Cheryl Keeney, Linden.

Each morning began with music followed by a Bible study led by an officer from the Global Missions Team. Bishop Jung then opened the business sessions and called for reports and action items.

There were 21 Action Items that required a vote. All passed. Some after much discussion.

Of local interest:

*Action Item 13: A Call to Action on Gun Violence.

*Action Item 18 A Resolution to authorize the Launch Out! Fund-raising campaign to raise money for establishing new churches.

*Action item 19, Approval of Conference Budget increase.

*Several Action Items that concerned Clergy. SPRC take note.

*Action Item Number 20 from the General Conference regarding discrimination against women.

*Conference Voted the Bishops' Plan for the United Methodist Church concerning policy on human sexuality. Representatives from

Wisconsin will vote accordingly at a special General Conference meeting in the near future.

*Action Item 21 called for the discontinuance of Kenwood United Methodist Church as voted by that membership.

Conference Celebrations with area ties:

*Parish of the Hills Churches received certificates for paying all Conference Claims for 2017. Linden church supporters, You Are the Best.

*Giving by the Wisconsin United Methodist Women was up by 3%.

*Pastor Craig Conklin - husband of former Parish of the Hills pastor, Mary Ann Conklin was commended for 25 years of service. The Conklin's will be retiring as full time clergy 4 years from now.

*Liana Daniels, age 13, granddaughter of Bill and Cheryl Keeney received "The Love in Action Award" and the "Thelma Gregg Award" at Conference for her fund-raising efforts in the area of health concerns. Her passion for mission first surfaced in 2014 when in 2 1/2 years, Lia raised more than \$6,000 to build a well in Africa. In 2016 she donated more than \$1000 to the Wisconsin Conference 'No More Malaria Campaign'. Last year, in the wake of worldwide natural disasters, she raised significant funds for World Hunger. Attached to the Thelma Gregg award is \$700.00 to be used for missions. Lia has decided to donate that money to a pediatric hospital in Haiti. She wants to thank all those who helped her succeed in her continuing efforts to help the less fortunate.

Love and KUDOs to the Linden United Methodist Women for their financial help, prayers, and heart for service.

Your Laity reps. learned that there will be no changes of clergy in the SW District. Amen!

They also report that John Welles, former clergy at the Livingston Church has retired.

Forrest Welles, a former minister in the Parish has been assigned to be District Superintendent to the SE area. Forrest sends his greetings to those he served here.

Despite great efforts on the part of Annual Conference officers, the number of persons who completed or began the process for full time ministry positions has decreased again this year. The number of churches who depend on pulpit supply on the other hand increased from 17 to 19. Please pray that revival fires seek out and touch the congregations of our great Methodist denomination once again and that we will experience new growth and new excitement in the area of ministry.

The 2019 Annual Conference is scheduled for over Father's Day weekend at the Middleton Marriott. At that time it's hoped there will be new faces serving as Laity members from Parish of the Hills.
