As I write this I am looking out the window at a gray and gloomy, rainy day. Even so, I am reminded of how blessed we all really are. My gloomy day is bringing much needed rain to our farmers (and to my wife's beautiful flowers). It is true that one person's joy may bring another's sorrow. But in the end, God balances things out. The hot, hot days that drive me inside into the air conditioning are needed for the corn to grow. Our few gloomy days are balanced by the beautiful sunny ones. God is truly good!

We achieved our goal of raising \$10,000 to repair the furnace. To all who helped with this major fund raising effortthank you! Thank you!! THANK YOU!!! Contracts have been let by the Trustees. Asbestos removal from the area will commence September 5th. The following week, boiler repairs will begin. Later, the week of September 13th, it is planned to install a boiler water treatment system. The repairs, together with the new boiler water treatment system, should give us another ten years of service from the heating system. There will be no heat or hot water available from September 5th until the work is completed approximately September 21st. Dave Vandewater, chairman of the Trustees, did a wonderful job coordinating the search for contractors, selecting the company for each segment of the job and letting the contracts. Thanks so much, Dave.

Janet Pollock has been Treasurer since 2016 and has done a great job. She arranged to not only pay all our own church expenses, and our obligations to the Parish, but to also be able to pay our Wisconsin Conference Apportionments in full each year. Thank you Janet! She has been having increasing physical problems that

have interfered with her ability to do the job. Fortunately, Karla Vogel has come forward and taken over for her. Welcome to our new Treasurer!

In the past year we had a funeral for Larry Mitchell and several baptisms when the sanctuary was uncomfortably (for the funeral I would say unbearably) hot. The Trustees and Administrative Council are now investigating the cost and benefits of installing an air conditioning system. I will let you know about developments as they occur.

A representative of the Church Mutual Insurance Company will visit us September 13th to see if we can reduce our insurance premiums without increasing our risk unacceptably. He will explain his findings to the Trustees and the Administrative Council that day. Insurance is one of the highest expenses in our budget.

We welcome Tristan Huxtable to our congregation. He was baptized Sunday, July 15. His parents are Sandy and David Huxtable. His grand parents are Scott and Jerilyn Owens and Marilyn Owens is his great grandmother.


