Some years ago, I hesitate to confess this, I, a man, read a Christmas article in a women's magazine. I want you to know it was an exception—not the rule—I want you to know that I am a 100% true man. I like football, steaks medium-rare, and I read Tom Clancy novels. And my favorite magazine is Sports Illustrated. But I just love this true story that I read once upon a time in Family Circle, a story written by Patricia Paden of Missouri. Let me share it with you. Mrs. Paden wrote:

"My brother and sister and I were feeling sad because the drought of the '30's had driven us from our home. Christmas would be a time of transition, spent with our Kentucky grandmother while our parents looked nearby for a suitable house and farmland."

"Grandma was a woman whose first memory was of adults whispering that Lincoln had been shot, and she was a great storyteller. One afternoon, Grandma settled herself by the stove and watched us children at play. My sister, Amy, and I had laid out all our dolls: large dolls with closing eyes and hair that we could comb, and our prized china dolls. We each had several of these china dolls, with movable arms and legs. My sister's favorite was Morgan, a boy doll dressed in a short blue suit. Grandma looked at the dolls and started reminiscing. 'When I was your age, I always wanted a china doll, but all my sister and I had were ragee dolls. Once we went to a rich girl's Christmas party, and there on the bed was a china doll. Oh, how I wanted to hold that doll! But I dared not, for if I had broken it, my whole family would have had trouble paying for it. So, I just stroked its arm—I never even picked it up."

There will be no service Christmas Eve morning this year. The Sunday School will take a break after Christmas and will start back up on February 11th.


Please plan on joining us for our annual Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, January 7th. Serving starts at 8am.
